The number of Pell grants in 2005-06 as a percentage of the total 12- month undergraduate enrollments in 2005-06 as reported on the FISAP. Calculated as the number of Pell grants divided by the 12-month enrollment reported in the FISAP. At colleges with large percentages of part-time and part-year students this will be substantially lower than Pell grants as a percentage of fall enrollment, which uses only the fall enrollment in the denominator.

The number of Pell grants in 2005-06 as a percentage of the total Fall 2005 undergraduate enrollments. Since the numerator (Pell grants awarded at any time in the 2005-06 academic year) and the denominator (enrollments in only the Fall term) measure different time periods, this will be higher than the number of Pell grants as a percentage of the unduplicated 12-month total enrollments reported in the FISAP.
